3 Fellows awarded Rosenthal Fellowships







Underlying a shift toward authoritarian rule have been the social stresses from population growth, urbanization, climate change, and rising health threats. These have contributed to failures of governance and popular disillusion about the promises of democratic rule. Disinformation and misinformation are further breeding distrust of institutions, civil society and traditional media.


